## BE SURE TO GIVE REGULAR VERBAL AND WRITTEN FEEDBACK TO YOUR INTERN.

As you approach the mid-point of the internship experience, it's easy to get into a routine that may not always include time that is set aside to conference with your student teacher. Work on squeezing in quality time to talk.

## Some ideas include:

- Have a set day/time to meet weekly for an overview of what the week will look like. EX) Every Monday morning weekly meeting at 7:30 am.
- Meet every day during lunch to talk about the day thus far. EX) Are there any tweaks to specific procedures or to the post-lunch lessons that can be discussed?
- Touch base at the end of the day. EX) Re-cap the day and check in on tomorrow's plans.
